


# The Connection Update

Dear Faithful Prayer Partners and Supporters,

We trust you are all doing great in His love. We would like to take this opportunity to give you an update on the last two months.

## Ministry News:

In our previous newsletter, we asked you to pray for our VBS program. I am pleased to let you know that the VBS went well. The theme of our VBS was "The Christian Soldier" (Ephesians 6:11-18). In fact, we shared many pictures with you at the beginning of August. During the five days, we taught the children Bible principles of spiritual warfare. These principles were emphasized through games and puppet shows as well. The great challenge for some of the children was telling the truth. There were many aspects concerning the belt of truth that we taught them but the one area that was so challenging to some of them was lying. The first case was with a boy who claimed that he did not receive any popcorn during food distribution and insisted on getting another bag. Then another boy pointed to his seat and there was a bag of popcorn hidden. So the teacher said to him, "Is that how you wear the belt of truth?" Then the boy shrank in his seat and did not ask for any more popcorn. The same thing happened with another boy on the last day of VBS with the same results but with Koffi confronting the boy. The reason we are telling you this story is to make the point between the sin nature which drives the kids and the Holy Spirit making real the teaching in their lives after they face reality. In fact, wearing the belt has become synonymous with telling the truth among the children themselves and in some homes. Attendance grew to 150 children by the last day of VBS. During VBS, 30 children and 12 adolescents were saved. We had movies and preaching in the evenings but no salvation decisions.



The legislative elections went well. We praise the Lord and thank you for your prayers.

The family is doing well. Joshua is now a senior and the exciting news is he has fewer financial obligations. God willing, he will graduate in May.

Some of you may be asking if we made it to the States. Yes, we made it on October 4. The goal is to report on our ministry and raise project funds to buy land for our first church in Atiegou.
