Family news

The month of September has been challenging health-wise for Koffi because he had malaria. It took two full treatments to get rid of all the plasmodium in the blood. Despite having screens on the windows and doors, malaria cannot be avoided 100% but we are thankful that treatment works.

Samuel is doing well. Since our return, he only finished one class. Because of covid-19 restrictions, it took us seven months to get the next set of courses for him, but we are glad to get those to keep him busy with school education.

We exchange often with Joshua over the phone and via Messenger. He is doing well. He had an injury on his foot after stepping over a nail, but the foot is almost healed.

Elisabeth is doing well. Thank you for the birthday cards you sent to her in July. We praise the Lord and give Him the glory for His watching over us.

Ministry News.

Dear friends, please continue to pray for Togo. After six months of confinement, the government has extended Covid-19 restrictions for another six months.

Since July 17, the government has partially reopened some churches, 39 per denomination, but none of our three churches were in the choices that were made. In the beginning of September, everybody thought all the churches were going to be reopened. But unfortunately, it didn't happen. We have no other option than to do small groups in houses with no singing. At the time of our writing, statistics show total cases of 1722, with 1312 people recovered and 44 deaths.

Preaching and Bible reading continue on WhatsApp. We have also decided to use a wireless speaker to preach the Gospel in marketplaces and on street corners. Since Covid-19 has affected people financially, we did a second distribution of corn in the church of Tamany and continued our assistance to the fatherless family. Many children have been born in the church of Tamany and were presented to the Lord in the families' homes. Hopefully, we will celebrate a wedding in the church of Kove by the end of the year.

Construction work resumed in Togokome. We have finished the wall instead of the shelter because somebody stole the dispatcher in the electrical counter

As field representative in Togo, I had the opportunity to deliver 25 hand-washing devices to pastors in our fellowship. Thanks to Dr. Newhart for his assistance.

Please help us drill water wells in the churches of Kove and Togokome.
